A huge thank you to those pupils and families who contributed an amazing 25 Christmas shoeboxes to our total of 180 boxes this year. These were delivered to the depot in Boscombe on 2nd November where they formed part of the total District collection of 19,145 shoeboxes which are now packed in 1,278 cartons on 112 pallets and set to go!

The overall total is slightly less than last year, largely thought to be due to increased living costs. However, as far as our club is concerned, our total was about the same as previous years and needless to say, our efforts will undoubtedly bring some pleasure this Christmas to disadvantaged and displaced children in Moldova, Montenegro, Romania and Ukraine (via Poland) including Ukrainian refugees in Poland.

Once again, a massive thank you to those who contributed and helped us continue our support to this worthy project.

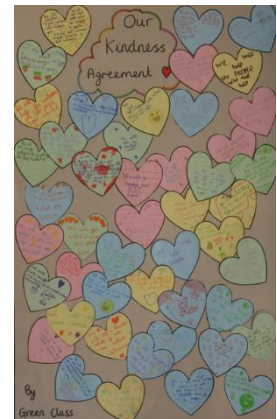
Children in Need
