## Spring Term 2 – 17<sup>th</sup> March 2026

Dear Parents and Carers

What a busy two weeks it has been! The Key Stage 2 residential was fantastic and the weather was kind to us, which was just what we needed. It doesn't seem possible that we are nearing the end of the spring term – it really has flown by.

### Residentials

Year 3 and 4 had a fantastic 3 days away at 'Home Farm' in Beaulieu, accompanied by Mrs May, Mrs Pink, Ms Humphries, Mrs Clegg and I – the sun shone and we had an amazing time. The children enjoyed tending and caring for the farm's animals, undertaking agricultural and gardening duties, going on a VERY long walk (it tired the children out for the second night!), a great evening by the camp fire, a visit from a falconry expert and his many birds, shelter building and a visit to the motor museum. We packed a lot into 2 days, it has to be said.

The children were an absolute pleasure and we had an amazing time away but there were a lot of tired children (and adults) at the end of the residential.



### Year 5/6 Little Canada

This residential was the week after Home Farm, so it was a very quick turnaround. We also had the added challenge of a sickness bug circulating, but with careful planning and mindful parents, Years 5 and 6 set off early on Monday 9<sup>th</sup> March, Isle of Wight bound!

Throughout the week, they enjoyed numerous activities including: fencing, climbing, blind trail and abseiling to name a few. Mr Firth, Assistant Headteacher, said 'The children were a credit to our school and were amazing throughout the week. It really was a great time away.' ## A few Reminders

We are continuing to see a lot of children wearing trainers and incorrect school uniform. I know only too well how expensive items such as school shoes are but please can you ensure that your child has the correct school uniform.

**Hair:** Please can you ensure that if your child has long hair (shoulder length and longer) that it is tied back. From a health and safety viewpoint, eg. During PE or at breaktime, this is much more appropriate.

**Earrings:** If your child has their ears pierced, they must only wear studs – not any dangly earrings please. Where possible, earrings should be taken out for PE or taped over. We have a small supply of tape in school but if you can provide this for your child, it would be very much appreciated. Please note, if your child is wearing dangly earrings, they will be asked to remove them.

**Jewellery and nail polish:** Children must not wear any other jewellery such as bracelets or necklaces and nail varnish is not permitted. We do have some nail varnish remover and we will ask children to remove nail varnish.

**PE kit:** In addition to this, if your child has not got their PE kit, we will, as far as possible, get them to take part in the lesson and they will receive a 'neutral' do-jo for a lack of kit. If this happens again, it will result in a negative do-jo.

**Focus tools:** Finally, we are also noticing an increase in children bringing in their own 'focus tools' or cuddly toys. We are very happy to provide focus tools if there is a specific need but please can we ask that, unless it has been agreed with the SENCo, that children do not bring their own from home.

This is because, ones that are not school-based have, in the past, for example, burst and I have known this to cause an allergic reaction.

## Attendance

Thank you ever so much for the support and vigilance you all showed in response to the sickness bugs that have been circulating. These seem to have improved and hopefully with the warmer, sunnier weather, we will all be a bit healthier!

As Headteacher, I am required to focus on children's attendance and this is something that both the local authority, Hampshire County Council and Department for Education (DfE) look at and monitor. This is also a focus in the new OFSTED framework and part of our Safeguarding procedures.

I know that there are times when children cannot help being poorly and if they are sick, there are times they need to stay at home. However, if your child has, for example, a headache or a tummy ache, we can always administer liquid paracetamol here and keep a close eye on them, calling you if need be. We have a team of trained first aiders and the ladies in the office are well versed at providing medical care when needed.

A child is deemed '*persistently absent*' when their attendance falls below 90% and this equates to just one day off every two weeks or 19 school days over the course of a year.

The effects of this can be:

- Academic underachievement – there is a clear correlation between attendance and attainment. Research shows that students with high absence rates are less likely to achieve 9-4 grades at GCSE.
- Social, emotional development and mental health – children miss out on crucial interaction, bonding with peers and having to catch up when they return is tricky
- Reduced future earnings – data shows that students who are frequently absent could earn £10,000 less at age 28

I know only too well, as a Mum, that there are times when children struggle to come to school or when you are finding things hard too. Please rest assured that we are here to help and support and work with you if there are things that are affecting your child's attendance.

## Outstanding Debts

As we fast approach the end of the Spring term, this coincides with the end of the financial year. **Please ensure that all debts for trips, dinners and childcare clubs are paid before the 27 March to ensure we comply with the required deadline.**

## Match funding / company funding / re-decoration

If your company participates in match funding or donates staff time for renovations, please do get in touch. Following the recent successful re-decoration of the children's toilets, we are keen to re-vamp the staff toilets and school hall. If you are able to help with this, please get in touch.

Mr Wyatt, our caretaker, is planning to re-paint the staff toilets over the Easter holidays. If you can spare any time, please let the office know.

***We are also seeking to 'skim' the walls of the staff toilets. Are you a plasterer who would be willing to do this? If you are, do let us know!***
