



## Bags of Hope Project – Durley CE Primary School



This year, the children in Year 6 have been learning about displaced children and how they are being supported as well as how they can support those children and their families too through projects such as Bags of Hope.

Through money raised by events such as cake sales that the children hosted alongside younger peers, we were able to purchase both a Paddington Bear and a Paddington backpack which will be passed onto a displaced child.



The children also created luggage labels with prayers on, reflecting on what they have learnt over the previous lessons.



We have completed lots of learning to enhance children's understanding about refugees and displaced children and you can see some of our learning below from the various images. This has allowed the children to reflect on many elements including how they could support young people that have been displaced, both directly, and indirectly through the work that charities do.

Books were an important part of ensuring children had a good understanding of why children may be displaced and we shared what the main messages from the stories were.



The final part of the learning was for the children to create their own fact file which made part of our Wall of Hope display. The children picked a project from the UNHCR which focuses on projects and businesses that support and employ displaced people.
